She'll Flee U. S. If Government Seizes Her Home

BOSTON, (U. S. — Mrs. Ida Hedin, 66-year-old widow, says she'll go to Sweden on a refugee passport if the government succeeds in seizing her home to make way for an 11 million dollar quartermaster research laboratory.

Federal Judge George C. Sweeney yesterday gave Mrs. Hedin's lawyer until Friday to file briefs in the eminent domain proceedings in connection with the woman's Natick home.

"If I don't win, I will positively apply for a refugee passport," she said.

"That happens, this country is taking another step toward Communism. That's the way they do it in Russia."

Mrs. Hedin contends the government does not want her property for "public use" but rather for housing purposes.

Maine Lifer 52 Years Paroled as a Cook

THOMASTON, Maine (U. S. — Edward Graffam, 77, for 52 years a Maine State Prison inmate, looked forward today to a quiet, peaceful life.

Graffam, the prison's oldest inmate, was freed yesterday under a new state law permitting parole for lifers who have served at least 50 years.

Convicted of murder during a robbery—a crime he still denies committing—Graffam will work as a cook for two prison guards who maintain bachelor quarters.

"I've hoped and prayed for this day a great many years," he said.


