TOKYO, Aug. 27 (AP)—A second flight of B-36 intercontinental bombers is expected to arrive in Japan today on flights up to 10,000 miles in length. The bombers, which were dispatched to Japan from the Far East command last night, are expected to arrive on a nonstop trip from U. S. bases that was closed in Japan for several days.

## Nat'l. Lawyers Guild Described As Red

Atty. Gen. Brownell Has Proposed It Be Put  
On List Of Subversive Organizations, He Tells  
American Bar Ass'n

BOSTON, Aug. 27 (AP)—Atty. Gen. Brownell today described the National Lawyers Guild as the legal mouthpiece for the Communist party and announced he proposed to put it on his list of subversive organizations.

Brownell made the announcement in an address prepared for the American Bar Association (ABA), in convention here.

He said he had, earlier in the day, served notice on the guild of its proposed inclusion on the list which the government uses in checking the affiliations of federal workers in relation to their loyalty and security.

The notice means the guild has 10 days in which to ask for a hearing, if it desires to present evidence on why the organization should not go on the list.

The Brownell announcement followed adoption by the ABA

## Pre-School Lessons For Dad And Mother On New Pupils

Schoolbells will be ringing soon for some 630,000 Bay State youngsters, so now is the time for a complete health check-up, the state health department advised today.

Especially for tots entering school for the first time, declared Dr. R. Gerald Rice, director of the division of maternal and child health, a thorough physical and dental check-up is recommended. In this way, he pointed out, if any treatment is required, it can be completed before school starts and without handicapping the child later.

Dr. Rice also offered the following suggestions for mothers sending their children to school for the first time:

1. See that youngsters are protected against smallpox, diphtheria, whooping cough, and lock-

## Wellesley Girl's Condition Good

WELLESLEY, Aug. 27 (AP)—Miss Sylvia Plath, 20-year-old Smith College student discovered in the cellar of her home yesterday after a 40-hour police search, was reported in good condition at Wellesley-Newton hospital today. She is recovering from an overdose of sleeping tablets.

The girl was found yesterday lying in a cellar-like recess beneath the porch of her home, hidden by a pile of kindling wood.

An empty water jar and a bottle containing eight sleeping pills was found by her side. The bottle contained 48 pills, police said, when it was taken from the home.

A search began Monday when the girl's mother, Mrs. Aurelia S. Plath, a Boston University professor, told police her daughter had vanished after leaving a note that she was taking a hike.

Her daughter, a frequent contributor of fiction and poetry to leading magazines, had been unable to write lately, and had been depressed, her mother said.

## Busy Highway, Plus Three Schools, Equals One Big North Andover Traffic Problem



When school bells ring for the opening day Sept. 9 in North Andover several hundred youngsters will be cautioned by their fearful parents to "stop, look and listen" when they cross the much-traveled Chickering road highway at Main street, which is only a few hundred yards from the Kittredge school, the Johnson high school and the now-under-construction new high school. North Andover schools open for the 1953-1954 school year Sept. 9 with many parents vitally concerned for the safety of their young ones who will have to cross Route 125 at Chickering road and Main street where heavy traffic moves at open road speeds.

Two schools are presently located near this dangerous intersection, the Kittredge school and Johnson high school, with the new high school now under construction at the intersection. Last year 293 students were enrolled in the Kittredge school and 320 in Johnson high school.

Rep. John C. Bresnahan of Lawrence said Thursday that he has been requested by many of the youngsters' parents to seek legislative correction of this hazard and he will file a bill for the installation of an overpass or an underpass at Chickering road and Main street in the next session of the Massachusetts legislature.

Rep. Bresnahan said that he has personally inspected the site and believes it to be one of the worst hazards in the state relative to the safety of school children. Rep. Bresnahan said he has been as-

sured the co-operation of Rep. William Longworth of Methuen in seeking safety installation at this crossing.

He said he has observed that most vehicles pass through the intersection at high speed owing to the fact that the intersection is in the middle of a sharp incline, with cars rolling fast downhill and pushing ahead fast to make the hill. He said that at the present time blinker lights are in operation with pedestrian push buttons available to stop traffic, which he described as inadequate.
