Wellesley Girl's Condition Good

WELLESLEY, Aug. 27 (AP)—Miss Sylvia Plath, 20-year-old Smith College student discovered in the cellar of her home yesterday after a 40-hour police search, was reported [reported] in good condition at Wellesley-Newton [Wellesley] hospital today. She is recovering from an overdose of sleeping tablets.

The girl was found yesterday lying in a cellar-like recess beneath [beneath] the porch of her home, hidden [hidden] by a pile of kindling wood.

An empty water jar and a bottle containing eight sleeping pills was found by her side. The bottle contained 48 pills, police said, when it was taken from the home.

A search began Monday when the girl's mother, Mrs. Aurelia S. Plath, a Boston University professor [professor], told police her daughter had vanished after leaving a note that she was taking a hike.

Her daughter, a frequent contributor [contributor] of fiction and poetry to leading magazines, had been unable [unable] to write lately, and had been depressed, her mother said.
