**"Missing" Girl
Case Probed**

WELLESLEY, Aug. 27 (INS)
—A brilliant 20-year-old Smith college senior today was recovering [recovering] from an overdose of sleeping [sleeping] pills as police sought to determine [determine] if she spent the two days she was missing in a tiny cellar recess of her home.

Sylvia Plath, honor student and literary contributor to national magazines, was discovered lying behind a pile of kindling wood on a narrow ledge between the basement and a porch of her home. Beside her was found a water container and eight sleeping [sleeping] pills in a bottle which originally [originally] contained 50 tablets.

Police admitted it was possible she might have been in the cellar throughout the search for her. However, they pointed out that when she was found she was wearing different clothing than she wore when she was last seen.
