Miss Villani Married To G. J. Ferrera

WELLESLEY—State and local police, aided by 100 volunteers, intensified their search today for 20-year-old Sylvia Plath, brilliant Smith College senior.

She disappeared Monday afternoon from her home in Wellesley after leaving a note saying she was going for a walk. Authorities, who said a bottle containing 50 sleeping pills were missing from the girl's room, centered their search in the vicinity of Lake Waban and Morse's pond.

Miss Olga Villani, niece of Mr. and Mrs. Angelo Lumentl of 94 West street, was married to Gaetano James Ferrera, son of James Ferrera of 46 Parker street, Maynard, this morning in Sacred Heart of Jesus church. Miss Regina Scioi was maid of honor and James Gadoury was the best man.

The bride wore a formal gown of imported alencon lace and satin. The fitted lace bodice was fashioned with a wide portrait illusion neckline, outlined with sequin and pearl embroidered appliques. The sweeping satin skirt, ended in a long graceful train, and was also embroidered with lace appliques. Her veil of imported silk illusion was caught to a lace cap sewn with seed pearls. She carried a colonial bouquet of white roses and stefanotis with orchid center.

HOLYOKE (INS) — Authorities probing the slaying of Alderman Henry H. Noel last night expressed belief that 71-year-old political leader was killed by a .38 calibre pistol stolen from a Springfield filling station.

Noel was shot on Aug. 17 when he and his wife surprised a burglar on the first floor of their home.

The stolen pistol, one of two taken the morning of the murder, was recovered by police in Woonsocket, R. I. The other gun, a .32 calibre pistol, was found in possession of a Springfield burglary suspect who said he gave the .38 to a man in Woonsocket.
