Disease-Free 'Islands' Still Are Mystery to Science

Disease-free "islands" are still one of the greatest mysteries unsolved by modern science, Dr. Eugene H. Payne, a leading authority on tropical diseases, said last night.

SPEAKING on the General Electric Science Forum over WGY, he pointed out that even though it is surrounded by malaria-infested areas, one Brazil town of 15,000 people has been absolutely free of this disease for at least a century. Dr. Payne related that a number of the land-islands free of disease have been found in South America. Some of these areas are void of heart disease and hookworm though adjacent sectors report many such cases. Similarly, he said, insanity is practically unknown to Bolivians.

HE SAID THAT many theories have been developed as to why this immunity exists, but none has as yet been proved. Dr. Payne, who is a member of the Parke, Davis and Co. department of clinical investigation, stressed the importance of studying these remote peoples while they remain static. Once they mingle with other groups, science will lose its chance to determine how these people remain free from diseases which infect regions around them.

Missing Co-ed Found Alive Under Porch

WELLESLEY, Mass., Aug. 26 (AP)—A pretty 20-year-old Smith College senior—who vanished Monday after telling her mother she was going hiking—was found today semi-conscious but apparently uninjured under the porch of her home.

WHILE SEARCHERS fanned out in a widespread search, Sylvia Plath was located by her brother, Warren, 18, and her grandmother, Mrs. Aurelia Schobar, 66, who heard moaning coming from the cellar of their home. The girl was found behind a pile of lumber in a tiny space under the porch, through which entrance is gained by a 2 1/2 foot opening about five feet above the cellar floor. Police Chief Robert McVey said an empty water jar and a container of eight sleeping tablets were found by the girl's side. He said the bottle had contained 48 tablets when full.

Old Manuscript Found

VIENNA — A manuscript of psalter fragments, consisting of 24 psalm stanzas or parts of stanzas, was discovered recently in Austria. Professors at Vienna and Graz have identified the find, written in Latin, as dating back to the period of Charlemagne (752-814 A.D.).

HER MOTHER, Mrs. Aurelia S. Plath, a Boston University professor, said her daughter recently had been depressed because she felt "she was unworthy of the confidence held for her by the people she knew. For some time she had been unable to write either fiction or poetry."

Miss Plath was taken to Newton-Wellesley Hospital where a spokesman described her condition as "fair." The spokesman added that she had suffered "no apparent serious injury."

Renovated Wasserman Store Opens

Today's official opening of the newly renovated L. Wasserman meat market, Broadway, will introduce a frozen food depot where local and area families may buy quantity lots of meat, fish and frozen foods at wholesale prices.

Harold Wasserman, owner, explained that the customers will select the cuts of meat they want to buy. The market will do the cutting and hanging without charge to prepare the meat for the buyer's freezer or locker.

FROZEN FISH and frozen foods on sale in the retail store may also be purchased in larger lots in the depot for wholesale rates, Wasserman said. Depot customers, he reported, will pay the same prices as retail stores buying wholesale lots.

The market was started more than 30 years ago by the late Louis Wasserman. When he died in 1941, his son, Harold, took over. The firm has long conducted both a wholesale and retail meat business. Western steers are brought in dressed in carload lots, while local animals are brought in alive and slaughtered on the premises. The meat is processed into retail and wholesale cuts and also made into sausage products. Some is pre-

packaged and frozen for sale in the retail store.

Frozen foods for the new depot will be purchased directly from manufacturers, Wasserman noted.

THE RETAIL STORE has a new front and a completely remodeled interior. It is an all-refrigerated market offering meats, frozen fish, frozen food, dairy products, fresh-killed poultry, eggs and a large variety of cheeses and pre-packaged meat products. Items range from 40 varieties of frozen fish to frogs legs and lobster tails.

The meat, as previously, will be fresh cut and will be dispensed by men behind the counter. All other items will be sold on a self-service system. Two checkout counters are located near the door.

Wasserman emphasized that frozen products are kept frozen at all times, and are not allowed to get soft during transit or during defrosting operations. The freezer, he said, is as big as the market itself. Total refrigerated area used in the wholesale and retail businesses is eight times as large as the market, he added.

THE PROPRIETOR believes his new frozen foods depot plan is unique in New York state.

The firm employs between 30 and 40 persons in all operations.
