Rev. Howard Selby, Eastern States Exposition Head, Is Stricken With Heart Attack

Former Springfield Resident and Veteran Civic Leader, Businessman and Ordained Methodist Elder Dies at Wheel of Car

Stricken with a heart attack while driving his car, Rev. Howard W. Selby, 62, of 219 Chestnut St., West Newton, president of the Eastern States Exposition at West Springfield and a former resident of this city, died last night at Charlestown.

Mr. Selby, who lived here from 1917 to 1925, and was active in the affairs of Trinity Methodist Church and the Springfield Rotary Club, suffered the attack while driving from the offices of the United Farmers of New England, where he was general manager, to his home.

Diplomats Term Anglo-American Dispute Most Serious Since Start of Korean War

London, Aug. 25 (AP)—Prime Minister Winston Churchill met today with his cabinet in an emergency session designed to prevent the quarrel with the United States over India's presence at the Korean peace conference from becoming a disastrous western allied split.

Diplomats here said the Anglo-American differences arising from the dispute are the most serious since the start of the Korean war.

India wants to sit in as a member of the political conference which will attempt to settle Korea's future and which might be widened to include other Far Eastern problems.

Britain feels she should. The United States disagrees and the South Koreans have threatened to boycott the conference entirely if India is seated.

Concerned Over Controversy Informed sources reported that Churchill has become seriously concerned, because the Anglo-American alliance is the basis of
