**Bloodhound Aids
In Search
For Smith Coed**

WELLESLEY, MASS., Aug. 25 (AP)—Volunteer searchers and a bloodhound scoured woods and lake shores Tuesday for a brilliant, 20-year-old Smith College [College] girl who disappeared after leaving a note saying "I'm going [going] for a walk."

Sylvia Plath, a college senior [senior] and daughter of a Boston University professor, left her home Monday after writing that she'd return Tuesday.

Her mother, Mrs. Aurelia S. Plath, told police the girl has been "nervous" and under a physician's care for several months.

An honor student, she was editor of the *Smith Review*, the college literary magazine, last year as a junior. She was also a member of the school's press board and had sold several short stories and poems to national [national] magazines.
