The pair met at Zahedi's invitation. As a preliminary, Henderson had talked yesterday with the undersecretary of foreign affairs, Abdul Hussein Meftah.

Both Zahedi and Iran's Shah already have stressed publicly that Iran's government urgently needs financial help from any country that will give it. Former Premier Mohammed Mossadegh's long-deadlocked oil dispute with Britain has blocked Iran's onetime large oil exports, formerly the government's chief source of revenue.

Reports from Washington on Monday said Zahedi likely would get emergency financial aid from the United States if he asked for it. U. S. officials hope that the new premier, who ousted and arrested Mossadegh in a pro-Royalist uprising last week, will gack down on his country's Communists and eventually settle with the British.

Informed sources said Henderson and Meftah in their meetings yesterday reviewed Iranian-American relations in the light of the new government setup, with special emphasis on Iran's need for aid.

Washington officials estimate that Iran now is getting about 50 million dollars a year in direct and indirect help from the United States. This includes a 23 million dollar program of economic and technical assistance (Point Four), some 20 million dollars in military aid and the salary and expense money spent by about 500 American officials in the country.

Continue Search For Smith Senior

WELLESLEY, Aug. 26 (AP)— Search continued today for Sylvia Plath, 20, a Smith College senior who disappeared Monday after leaving a note for her mother that she was going for a hike.

The mother, Mrs. Aurelia S. Plath, a Boston University professor, said her daughter's disappearance may have been due to a temporary nervous disorder linked with her writing.

Miss Plath was editor of the Smith Review, the college literary magazine, last year, and has sold fiction and poetry to magazines and other publications.

Mrs. Plath said her daughter "recently felt she was unworthy of the confidence held for her by the people she knew. For some time she has been unable to write either fiction, or her more recent love, poetry.

"Instead of regarding this as just as arid period that every writer faces at times," the mother said, "she believed something had happened to her mind, that it was unable to produce creatively any more."

oneir campaign to get gamma globulin inoculations for 80 children began yesterday, when about 50 parents from a bungalow colony in Far Rockaway, Queens, marched into city offices.

They asked for the scarce blood derivative because a 32-year-old woman in the colony was stricken with polio last Friday. Turned down, some of the parents remained at the office in an all-night stand.

They read, chatted, knitted and played cards. A policeman remained in an adjoining room. But today, Health Department spokesmen again told the group there was no use waiting, as new "rigid rules" governing gamma globulin distribution did not entitle their children to any.

The spokesmen said the rules, adopted at a special Board of Health meeting yesterday, provide that the shots be allocated only "to household contacts," those under 30 years of age who have been living in intimate contact with a polio patient for at least 24 hours.

Officials said one case of the disease in the Rockaway colony did not constitute an emergency, and that limited supply of the drug made the rigid rules necessary.

Both federal and state officials have refused city requests for more gamma globulin.
