parley any of the 17 nations that fought under the U.N. flag in Korea. All non-belligerents, under the U. S. plan, would be barred from the U.N. delegation. Russia would be invited, if the Communist aggressor side "desires it."

The United States was assured of victory in its campaign to exclude India from the parley, Indian sources figured about 26 votes for their membership in the Korean conference. While this might provide a simple majority in the political committee it would fall short of the two-thirds majority required for final approval in the General Assembly.

Lodge closed the door on extensive assembly debate with the statement that the Reds did not have the right to say anything about the U.N. delegate to the conference but could choose delegates to represent their own side.

Vishinsky blasted back, saying Lodge was "slamming the door" on any attempt to negotiate differences over composition of the parley.

The Soviet delegate said the U.N. could not send an "ultimatum" to the Communists dictating conditions of submission and obedience.

He said such a course would wreck the conference before it began.
