

Asia Differences May Speed Allied Talks

LONDON, Aug. 25 (AP)—Allied differences over Asian policies may revive the need for early top-level talks among American, British and French leaders, informed officials reported today.

So far as can be established no new action has been taken officially by any of the three governments to suggest President Eisenhower, Prime Minister Churchill and French Premier Joseph Laniel should meet. The initiative would seem to rest with Churchill. The Bermuda conference of the three—originally set for early last July—was postponed at his request when he fell ill. Foreign Office spokesmen always have been careful to say the project has not been formally abandoned.

New Iran Premier Wants Aid Rushed

TEHRAN, Iran, Aug. 26 (AP)—Iran's new Premier today appealed urgently for immediate U. S. financial aid to stave off economic collapse of this strategic nation, an informed source said.

Premier Fazollah Zahedi conferred at length with U. S. Ambassador Loy Henderson and sources in close touch with the discussions said they revolved around Iran's near bankruptcy.

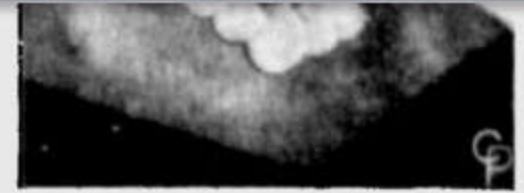
MISSING GIRL FOUND UNDER PORCH

WELLESLEY, Mass., Aug. 26 (AP)—A pretty 20-year-old Smith College senior—who vanished Monday after telling her mother she was going hiking — was found today semi-conscious but apparently uninjured under the porch of her home.

While searchers fanned out in a widespread search, **Sylvia Plath** was located by her brother and her grandmother who heard moaning coming from the cellar of their home.

Police Chief Robert McVey said an empty water jar and a container of eight sleeping tablets were found by the girl's side. He said the bottle had contained 48 sleeping tablets when full.

Her mother, Mrs. Aurella S. **Plath**, a Boston University professor, said her daughter had been depressed because she felt "she was unworthy of the confidence held by her by the people she knew."

Himalayan Peak Defeats Yank Expedition

KARACHI, Pakistan, Aug. 26 (AP)—Death and injuries have foiled a 9-man American mountain-climbing expedition in its attempt to scale Mt. Godwin-Austen (K2), the world's highest unconquered peak.

Delayed reports from Kashmir today said Arthur K. Gilkey, a 26-year old New York geologist, gave his life in the attempt.
